For Windows XP users who are craving the smooth, classic visual style of Mac OS X, but cannot install macOS. There is a solution! The Downloader window will introduce you to the world of downloading themes for Windows XP's start menu. No need to touch your computer's registry any more--simply download all the themes you want and put them on a USB drive. Customize your new look with these resources that run in WinAmp! Recently I had this dilemma that I was just at my wit's end with trying to figure out how to fix it myself. It was frustrating because I know there are better ways of doing things, but sometimes there are no other options available. I will mention, since I am a Windows user, this tutorial should work for XP. It is unlikely that it will work for other systems due to the particular nuances of the XP start menu and how it works, though I hope to try downloading these files onto another partition (System Restore) one of these days. My basic problem was that the URL's in my New Tab page were no longer working or linking properly. I've used Firefox/Netscape for years, but had not used Safari until recently, when I discovered tabs. At first sight the new system looks nice and streamlined so I didn't mess with it too much--that is until I tried to open several favorite pages via links. Safari stopped responding entirely for a little while and then just went berserk, opening up a bunch of new windows that I couldn't control, couldn't close, and couldn't even move off my desktop. Needless to say, I wasn't too happy with the new "improvement." After trying unsuccessfully to fix it by searching online for solutions, I decided it was time to re-install Firefox. Then I had the problem of how to import all my bookmarks from Safari...searching again revealed no help. So I decided to take matters into my own hands and find out what files that Safari uses that Firefox could also use. I found 2 files by chance--the first one contained all the tabs, and the other contained key command functioning. I switched these over to Firefox ... voilà, it worked! It wasn't pretty, but at least I could navigate again. So here are the 2 files that you will need for this little trick. Download them to your hard drive, open them with an editor (Notepad++ for example), copy everything from them except the first line of text beginning with "//", and paste it into a new text document. Rename the file "userChrome.css" or something similar, then load it into your Firefox browser by going to Tools > Page Setup > Style Sheets > User Stylesheet > Load... Once the file has loaded, you should be able to go to Tools > Options > Content > Fonts & Colors, make any changes you want to tweak the look further, close the dialogs, and open a new tab to see your changes in action! I'm no graphic designer or stylesheet pro by any means, so I didn't take any time to prettify my tabs. I just used them for their intended purpose--and they work wonderfully!
